Yes, that includes you - your neighbors, block units, businesses, community organizations and countless others, too! You can do a little or a lot. Every little bit helps so rally your family, friends and neighbors to:

- Pick up litter from the streets and alleys in your area
- Plant and maintain flowers in public green spaces
- Organize a massive seasonal clean-up for your entire community

You decide when and where to clean and beautify! Then, register your project with Brightside to reserve hand tools (brooms, rakes and shovels), trash bags and recycling carts for your project.

To maximize your efforts, consider scheduling your Blitz clean-up the weekend before your neighborhood's bulk pick-up, annual house tour or other community event.

Register by April 30 to request FREE annual flower seedlings for planting on public property. Flowers will be available for pick up May 5 and 6 at the Greenhouse in Forest Park. Fight the Bite this year by keeping your yard free of standing water. As little as a bottle cap full of standing water is enough for a mosquito to lay eggs. At least once a week, remove standing water from gutters, planters, toys, tires and pools to eliminate mosquito breeding grounds. Be sure to pick up litter, too. Better yet, plan a Blitz clean-up to help your whole community keep mosquitos away!

Saint Louis City Recycles Small Steps. BIG IMPACT.

Recycling is easy! Make room for a recycling bin in your home and fill it with your bottles, cans, containers, paper and cardboard. Keep recyclables clean and dry and then pour them loose into the City blue recycling dumpster or rollcart.

Spring cleaning? Before you reach for the trash can, find out how you can keep almost any unwanted item out of the landfill by visiting www.STLCityRecycles.com/database

Blitz clean-up? You can reserve recycling carts for your clean-up events now, too! Fill them with bottles and cans and then empty the cart into a blue City recycling dumpster.

Recycle electronics and shred confidential papers at 1660 S. Kingshighway, 314-664-1450. Computers, TVs, gaming equipment - almost anything with a cord - can be recycled. Some items have a small fee.

Paint thinners, pesticides and other household hazardous wastes can be recycled, too. Check out www.HHWstl.com to learn more. Appointment required. To find your monthly bulk pick-up week, visit www.StLouis-Mo.gov/streets; call the Citizens' Service Bureau (CSB) at 314-622-4800; or call Brightside at 314-772-4646.

Reached your 3 bulk pick-up item limit for the month? If you can't recycle or donate those items, take them to the City transfer station. For details visit www.StLouis-Mo.gov and search "resident drop off."
