Since 1982, Operation Brightside, now dba Brightside St. Louis, has worked to clean and green St. Louis through initiatives which enrich and beautify by restoring, maintaining and growing the community landscape.

2015 Accomplishments

Graffiti Eradication



Brightside preserves property values. By removing graffiti from vandalized homes, businesses and public spaces, Brightside preserves property values and strengthens neighborhoods. At no cost to the property owner, in 2015 Brightside eradicated 370,870 square feet of graffiti from 3,927 vandalized spaces.

Demonstration Garden and Learning Center

Brightside demonstrates sustainability. Brightside's highly-visible garden at the corner of Kingshighway and Vandeventer features storm water best management practices, Missouri native plants and innovate forestry techniques. Garden is open at all times for visitors to learn what they can



replicate at home, in their neighborhood and future community projects.

Community Cleaning and Greening Efforts

Brightside – making St. Louis a better place. Over 20,000 volunteer hours are invested in community cleaning efforts from alley clean-ups to major planting projects. In 2015, volunteers collected millions of pounds of trash and debris in 260 neighborhood clean-up projects using 2,561 tools and filling more than 17,500 Brightside trash bags

Brightside greens St. Louis. In 2015, Brightside volunteers planted over 204,000 annuals, perennials, grasses, shrubs and trees to beautify neighborhood entrances, parks, schools, medians, vacant lots and other public green spaces including 40 neighborhood gardens and assisted in establishing 33 Milkweeds for Monarchs gardens. Brightside's efforts are visible all over St. Louis in Neighbors Naturescaping gardens; Flowers for Downtown projects; Blitz Blooms' plantings; Highway Daffodils; Gardens at Lake Louie and our Demonstration Garden.



To help support our cleaning and greening initiatives, individuals, businesses and community organizations purchased daffodils, tulips and lilies through our Blooming Soon! flower sale.

Brightside promotes litter awareness and recycling as ways to protect the environment and make St. Louis more sustainable. In 2015, Brightside took on the responsibility of recycling outreach and education for the City of St. Louis.
