# Building Butterfly Gardens

Brightside's Demonstration Garden gained some well-deserved recognition on Earth Day when Mayor Francis Slay planted milkweed in our butterfly garden and announced a new City initiative, *Milkweeds for Monarchs: The St. Louis Butterfly Project.* 

Recent reports of dwindling Monarch butterfly populations have spurred an outpouring of support for the beloved butterfly and people everywhere want to know how they can help preserve this iconic creature. Researchers have pointed to the loss of milkweed (the Monarch caterpillar's only food source) as the main cause of their decline.

Brightside has joined the effort to restore Monarch habitat and is offering educational resources to help St. Louisans become more knowledgeable about restoring habitat. In fact, the butterfly gardening workshops were the hottest topics at the recent Urban Gardening Symposium.

Brightside's Demonstration Garden is open at all times. If you come by during business hours please stop into the office and pick up information on butterfly gardening and learn about the St. Louis Monarch Mix.

To help community groups establish neighborhood butterfly gardens, we are encouraging Neighbors Naturescaping applicants to include milkweeds and nectar source plants into their project request.






# GREAT STAFF

# ST. LOUIS URBAN GARDENING SYMPOSIUM SUCCESS



Brightside recently hosted the first St. Louis Urban Gardening Symposium, a half-day event featuring ten educational workshops ranging from butterfly gardening to tree and lawn issues and everything in between. Attendees spent the morning in Brightside's Demo Garden learning from some of St. Louis' finest plant and tree experts.

The Demo Garden served as a valuable learning tool which enabled participants to see native plants first-hand plus observe some of the wildlife that native gardens support. The workshops gave participants the knowledge they need to establish and care for their plants as well as to incorporate sustainable practices and features into their gardens at home and in their community.

Through Neighbors Naturescaping, each year Brightside helps community groups create or enhance public green spaces. The symposium attracted many interested community members who took advantage of the workshops to learn how to plan, plant and maintain their community gardens.

Through Neighbors Naturescaping, any community group in the city can submit a proposal to improve their neighborhood. Brightside reviews all applications and provides Missouri native plants and tools to approved projects.

### **GET YOUR SOIL TESTED**

Are your plants losing their leaves? Do you have trouble growing grass? Are insects destroying your garden? Before you reach for a bottle of fix-it-quick, consider finding out what the true problem is by getting your soil tested.

Often, problems with our lawns, plants and trees begin with the soil. Soil pH and nutrient levels can affect a plant's health and unhealthy plants are susceptible to insects and diseases that can damage or kill the plant.

Before you spend a bunch of money on products that only treat the symptoms, invest in a soil test that can help pinpoint the cause of the problem. Drop off your soil sample at Brightside and we'll send it to the Soil Testing Lab at the University of Missouri. The horticulture specialists at UM-Extension will review your results and advise you on soil amendments and treatments to improve your plants' health. Depending on the soil test that you need, prices vary so please contact us for additional information.

Thank you to all of the Give STL Day donors and to the Greater Saint Louis Community Foundation for making Give STL Day possible. We're looking forward to next year!






