NEIGHBORS NATURESCAPING

Do you ever see people planting flowers, pulling weeds or watering plants in street medians, neighborhood entrances or other public green spaces? Do you ever wonder who they are or what they are doing? There's a good chance they're part of Brightside's Neighbors Naturescaping program.

Through Neighbors Naturescaping, any community group in the city can submit a proposal to improve their neighborhood by planting native gardens in public spaces. Projects range from small butterfly gardens to large park plantings and everything in between. Regardless of the garden's size, all Neighbors Naturescaping projects benefit each community in similar ways. Aside from beautifying a public space, these gardens restore Missouri native plant habitat which attracts beneficial wildlife and increases biodiversity. They also improve soil drainage, helping to reduce storm water runoff and filter out pollutants to protect water quality.

Neighborhoods also benefit in other important ways. When residents work together in their garden they are building relationships that strengthen their commitment to the community and to each other, which results in increased property values. Gardens also help connect people with nature, which has proven to provide valuable benefits for our health and wellbeing.

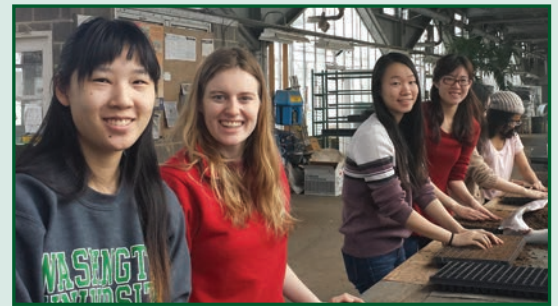

SLUGS



One beautiful June morning brought more than 100 participants to Brightside's Demonstration Garden for the 2nd annual St. Louis Urban Gardening Symposium (SLUGS). The Demo Garden served as the perfect classroom for hands-on learning opportunities as the garden allowed instructors to lead groups through our urban oasis to observe real-life examples of native plants and beneficial wildlife relevant to their topics.

Each workshop provided participants with information they can use plus share with others to incorporate native plants and sustainable gardening practices into their own yards and neighborhood gardens.

The Demo Garden is a great resource yet it's not always possible to visit in person. Fortunately, you can also visit us online! Simply go to www.brightsidestl.org/what-we-do/demonstration-garden/ and browse any time. You can see what plants are growing, learn about the storm water runoff reduction features hidden beneath the surface and get the scoop on urban forestry best management practices that make our garden one-of-a-kind.

What would the world be like without bees? Many people don't realize just how much our daily lives depend on pollinators, especially bees. About 75% of crop plants grown worldwide for food, beverages, fibers, condiments, spices and medicines are pollinated by animals, including bees.

Though the disappearance of honey bees is well known, the loss of native bees may be even more devastating. To learn how land-use decisions in St. Louis are impacting pollinator health, St. Louis University professor, Dr. Gerardo Camilo, and a group of SLU students are taking their research to gardens across the area, including Brightside's Demo Garden!

Once per week, Dr. Camilo's research team shows up in our garden, armed only with insect nets and notebooks. As the bees fly from flower to flower, the team identifies different species and collects samples which are later analyzed to determine which plants the bees are visiting. The group hopes their research will help to improve urban bee communities and benefit people living in the urban core.

WALKING ON BROKEN GLASS



Brightside's newest permeable surface is adding even more color to our Demo Garden. This sparkly, Filterpave pathway is made from recycled glass bottles and crushed river rock. Approximately 16,500 old bottles are now living a new life in our garden pathway, keeping valuable resources out of the landfill and reducing the need to extract raw materials from the earth.

The crushed glass and rock are held together by a plant-based polymer which maintains voids between the pieces, allowing water to flow through the pavement and infiltrate into the ground, reducing storm water runoff during rain events.

Funding for the Filterpave pathway was provided by the **Environmental Protection Agency** Region 7 through the **Missouri Department of Natural Resources** under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act, Missouri Department of Natural Resources Subgrant G11-NPS-13.



The Monarch butterfly's unique migration from Mexico to Canada and back each year is a wondrous feat. But, their dramatic population decline over that last 20 years has caught the attention of butterfly lovers across the U.S. and people are asking, "What can I do to help?"

One of the easiest things people can do is plant more native milkweeds and nectar sources. In fact, the City of St. Louis is encouraging residents, businesses, schools and other organizations to establish their own butterfly gardens. Now

in it's second year, the City's initiative, **Milkweeds for Monarchs: The St. Louis Butterfly Project**, aims to increase Monarch habitat in St. Louis by making butterfly gardening easy. To do this, the City's Sustainability Office has developed various resources, including a list of butterfly-friendly

plants (STL Monarch Mix), a directory of places that sell the plants and tips on how to plant and care for your garden. All of these are available online at www.stlouis-mo.gov/sustainability.

Help St. Louis reach its goal of 250 butterfly gardens by planting yours today. Be sure to register your garden at the website above to be counted toward the 250 goal. Once you're registered, your garden will be added to the map of STL Monarch gardens and you'll be offered a special Milkweeds for Monarchs sign to recognize your efforts.

WHAT TO DO WITH HHW?



Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) are the products around your home that contain chemicals which are toxic, flammable, corrosive or reactive. These products are safe when used and stored properly, however, when they become unusable and are no longer wanted, they are considered HHW.

Some examples include paints, stains, varnishes, pesticides, herbicides, poisons, gasoline, solvents, strippers, aerosols, gas cylinders, fluorescent tubes, rechargeable batteries, automotive fluids, pool chemicals, wood preservatives, mercury-containing items, etc.

So, what can you do with HHW? Residents of St. Louis City and County, as well as Jefferson County can now take HHW to one of two collection centers. You must make an appointment so visit www.hhwstl.com today. Help protect our environment by properly disposing of or recycling your HHW.

MONTHLY BULK PICK-UP

Old furniture and appliances taking up space in your garage or basement? Did you know that the City of St. Louis picks up bulky items once a month? It's true, if the City collects your trash they will also collect your bulky items if you follow the Refuse Division's guidelines.

WHAT: Up to **3 large items** per household per month (Examples: furniture, electronics, automotive batteries, motor oil, appliances, tires, and tied bundles of branches no longer than three feet.)

WHEN: Place all items outside of the home by **6AM** on the **Monday of your regularly scheduled collection week**. To find out when your collection week is, check the City's website at www.stlouis-mo.gov/data/address-search/ (enter your address and scroll down to the "Trash and Maintenance" section. Or, call the Citizens' Service Bureau at 314-622-4800 or Brightside at 314-772-4646.

WHERE: Residents with **curbside** collection should place bulk items at the curb. Residents with **alley** collection should place bulk items in alley **directly behind home, not by trash dumpster**.

WHY: Following the bulky pick-up schedule helps keep the streets, alleys and dumpsters as clean and tidy as possible.

Electronics, car batteries, motor oil, appliances and tires will be collected separately from other bulk items and will be recycled.



Fear no more, you no longer have to be buried under your old electronics! The Operation Brightside Recycling Center, operated by Earth Circle Recycling, offers recycling for a multitude of electronic equipment and small appliances. Recycle your old laptop or phone, the fax machine you forgot you had, the VHS player you found in the basement or even Grandma's old toaster.

You can bring all of the power supplies and cables you have too! Essentially anything with a cord is accepted, but the list of accepted items continues to grow so please visit www.earthcirclerecycling.com or call 314-664-1450 for details. The drop-off center is located at 1660 S. Kingshighway Blvd 63110, next to the City of St. Louis Water Division, and is open Mon-Sat 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Bottles, cans, paper and cardboard products are accepted as well. Bulk paper shredding services are also available, so call 314-664-1450, for more details and to make an appointment.

Protecting NEIGHBORHOODS

Every day, St. Louis homes, businesses, schools, churches, playgrounds and public spaces are vandalized with graffiti. Graffiti threatens the sense of safety and stability in neighborhoods. By quickly removing these taggings, Brightside crews reduce the occurrence of repeat vandalism, protect property values and make people feel safer in their own community.

So far this year, **Brightside crews have removed 145,500 square feet of graffiti from 1,781 vandalized properties** at no cost to the property owners.

FOUNDERS PLAZA

It's not too late to be a part of commemorating the anniversary of our city's founding. As a lasting legacy of the 250th anniversary, Founders Plaza will be built around the statue of Pierre Laclede which stands on the west side of City Hall. The statue depicts Pierre Laclede as he is stepping off of his boat in 1764 and onto the riverbank of the mighty Mississippi in what was to become the City of St. Louis.

Brightside volunteers will recognize this statue of Laclede and use the new plaza as the meeting location for our annual flower planting effort each May.

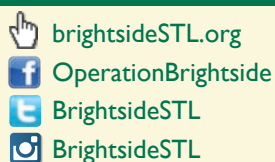
